How many days in advance will be necessary to set up the required equipment? We intend to confer with Countrywide in order to share equipment and minimize the burden on the Court as much as possible.	The set-up will take approximately half a day. The parties recognize that the proposed size of the venire is quite large. However, in addition to typical reasons that jurors cannot serve, the parties anticipate higher numbers of jurors will represent that susceptibility to illness or lack of childcare will make jury service a severe hardship.

The parties are available to discuss the above, as well as any other logistical information pertinent to the upcoming trial, at the Court's convenience. In addition, the parties request a conference at the Court's convenience to discuss the COVID-19 precautions it will implement when trial proceeds.
